

**2013 Weingut Salwey Grauburgunder
Oberrotweiler Henkenberg GG**

Intensely yellow in color, the 2013 Grauburgunder Oberrotweiler Henkenberg GG has a deep, pure and subtle bouquet that displays crushed stone flavors with lemon and orange aromas. Full-bodied, very clear and complex on the palate, this is a very elegant and finesse-full Pinot Gris with a long, salty finish full of tension. The wine does not have the power, body and structure of the sibling from the Eichberg, but more finesse, elegance and delicacy.

Konrad Salwey cultivates a total of 20 hectares in Banden's Kaiserstuhl area. Equal parts of Spätburgunder (Pinot Noir) and Grauburgunder (Pinot Gris) sum up to 80% of the total, which is complemented by 15% Weissburgunder (Pinot Blanc) and 5% Chardonnay. To the top sites belong the Oberrotweiler "Grosse Lagen" (grands crus) Henkenberg, Eichberg, and

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**2013 Weingut Salwey Weissburgunder
Oberrotweiler Henkenberg GG**

From 27-year-old vines on weathered vulcan soils, the 2013 Weissburgunder Oberrotweiler Henkenberg GG offers a clear, pure bouquet of white fruits and lemon flavors. Medium-bodied on the palate, this elegant, well structured Pinot is not as complex and powerful as a grand cru should be, but the vitality, freshness and good grip in the finish makes this a lovely food wine for the next five or six years.

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**2013 Weingut Salwey Grauburgunder
Oberrotweiler Eichberg GG**

From 37-year-old vines on tuff soils, Salwey's intensely yellow-colored 2013 Grauburgunder Oberrotweiler Eichberg GG offers a clear and fresh, deep, intense and spicy flavored Pinot bouquet; this leads to a full-bodied, very elegant, pure and well balanced palate, which reveals a stimulating freshness and salinity in the long, tension-filled finish. There is lots of lemon-freshness in this complex but still very young Pinot Gris from the excellent Eichberg terroir.

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**2013 Weingut Salwey Weissburgunder
Oberrotweiler Kirchberg GG**

Clear, lemon-fresh and chalky on the pure and precisely mineral nose starts the 2013 Weissburgunder Oberrotweiler Kirchberg GG; it comes from vines planted in 1979 and 2009 on the rocky vulcan soils of the Kirchberg Grosse Lage, which also gives the Pinot Noir its great vitality and tension. This Pinot Blanc is an expressive, full-bodied, very pure, precise and elegant Pinot Blanc of great complexity and tension. Full of vitality and salt, this Pinot Blanc finishes with grip and an almost chalky texture. Very much Burgundy-like. Not yet imported into the United States.

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**2013 Weingut Salwey Spatburgunder
Oberrotweiler Henkenberg GG**

Aged for 12 months in new barriques, the 2013 Spätburgunder Oberrotweiler Henkenberg GG shows a clear cherry color and a lovely, clear, fresh and delicate sour cherry and red/dark berry aroma on the nose, along with spicy/floral flavors of violets, toast, cigar box, raw meat and discreet oak flavors. Pure and juicy on the silky textured palate, this full-bodied, refreshing and finesse-full Pinot Noir from old and younger vines on weathered vulcanic soils (clones and mass selections were planted in 1968 and 2009) reveals a straight character, as well as a good vitality and characterful length. Bone dry and still young, this Pinot Noir should be at its best between 2017 and 2023.

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**2013 Weingut Salwey Spatburgunder
Oberrotweiler Eichberg GG**

Lovely, pure, fresh, ripe and intense on the delicately floral and stony nose, the 2013 Spätburgunder Oberrotweiler Eichberg GG shows all signs of a great and highly elegant Spätburgunder from the Kaiserstuhl. From vines planted in 1976 and 1987, this is a generous, very open, rather warm, velvety textured, sweet and very juicy Pinot Noir with super ripe fruit flavors of cherries, red currant and plums; it has ripe and soft tannins as well as finesse and freshness in its majestic flow. This is a bloody young wine with a great future ahead. A beautiful example for the Kaiserstuhl Pinot Noir type.

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**2013 Weingut Salwey Spatburgunder
Oberrotweiler Kirchberg GG**

Dark and intense in its cherry color the unfiltered 2013 Spätburgunder Oberrotweiler Kirchberg GG shows a lovely fruit ripeness and freshness on the nose (plums, blackberries, raspberries, violets) which is perfectly intertwined with floral and pure vulcanic and charcoal aromas as well as delicate spicy notes from new oak barrels. Round, pure and finesse-full on the juicy, fresh and well structured palate this refreshing and very elegant Pinot Noir reveals a very good concentration of ripe fruit, tension and length. It's a Pinot that is both delicate and charming as well as expressive and tension-filled and provided with a refreshing grip and very good aging potential. An excellent Pinot Noir from the Kaiserstuhl.

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
